

## DAILY BIBLE VERSES AND PRAYER THOUGHTS

"Honour thy father and (thy) mother" is found 8 times in the Bible. Twice in the Old Testament and 6 times in the New. If God repeated this command that many times, don't you think it was important to Him. The command to not kill is only found 7 times.

**MONDAY** - VERSES: Exodus 21:17; Leviticus 20:9; Proverbs 20:20

PRAYER THOUGHT: Ask forgiveness for anytime you did not give your parents the respect they deserved.

**TUESDAY** - VERSES: Deuteronomy 27:16; Proverbs 30:11,17

PRAYER THOUGHT: Thank God that you have not died for failing to give honor to your parents and strength to correct your attitude in the future.

**WEDNESDAY** - VERSES: Mark 7:9-13 PRAYER THOUGHT:

Ask God's help in caring for your aging parents, and for help teaching others to care for their parents.

**THURSDAY** - VERSES: Matthew 15:4 - What age would you have 'died the death' if God enforced this?

PRAYER THOUGHT: Thank God that he is merciful and pray that you learn from your mistakes.

**FRIDAY** - VERSES: Deuteronomy 21:18-21 PRAYER

THOUGHT: Pray for a tender and obedient heart and that we will be a people obedient to our parents and more importantly to God.

**SATURDAY** - VERSES: Deuteronomy 22:13-21 PRAYER

THOUGHT: Pray that purity both physical and spiritual will once again become something that is desirable and sought after, that we will bring honor and not shame on our parents by our actions, and teach our young the shame and consequences of sin.

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Even if your parents are no longer living you can honor their memory by living the life God wants you to live.

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### Seated Next To The Butcher

In the Talmud, the rabbis tell of the time when...

## HONOR YOUR PARENTS

SCRIPTURE - (Eph 6:1-4) Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. {2} "Honor your father and parents," which is the first commandment with promise: {3} "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth." {4} And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.

### INTRODUCTION

#### A. WHAT MY PARENTS TAUGHT ME

My parents taught me LOGIC..."If you fall off that swing and break your neck, you can't go to the store with me."

My parents taught me MEDICINE..."If you don't stop crossing your eyes, they're going to freeze that way."

My parents taught me TO THINK AHEAD..."If you don't pass your spelling test, you'll never get a good job!"

My mother taught me ESP..."Put your sweater on; don't you think that I know when you're cold?"

My parents taught me TO MEET A CHALLENGE..."What were you thinking? Answer me when I talk to you...Don't talk back to me!"

My parents taught me HUMOR..."When that lawn mower cuts off your toes, don't come running to me."

My parents taught me how to BECOME AN ADULT..."If you don't eat your vegetables, you'll never grow up."

My mother taught me about GENETICS..."You are just like your father!"

My parents taught me about my ROOTS..."Do you think you were born in a barn?"

My parents taught me about the WISDOM of AGE..."When you get to be my age, you will understand."

My mother taught me about ANTICIPATION..."Just wait until your father gets home."

My parents taught me about RECEIVING...You are going to get it when we get home.

and my all time favorite thing my parents taught me—JUSTICE..."one day you will have kids, and I hope they turn out

just like YOU..then you'll see what it's like."

B. The word "honor" means to "esteem and value as precious"; to show respect, reverence, kindness, courtesy, and obedience.

C. Scripture is not speaking to any certain age child. It is speaking to all of us who are children with parents still living. We are to honor our fathers and mothers: to esteem and value them as precious—to respect and reverence them.

D. Tragically, this is a rarity today. Too often a child's response to his parent is that of dishonor, disobedience, disrespect and lack of appreciation

### I. HONOR YOUR PARENTS WITH OBEDIENCE

A. (Eph 6:1) Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right.

B. (Col 3:20) Children, obey your parents in all things, for this is well pleasing to the Lord.

C. (Prov 30:17) The eye that mocks his father, And scorns obedience to his mother, The ravens of the valley will pick it out, And the young eagles will eat it.

### II. HONOR YOUR PARENTS WITH RESPECT

A. (Prov 20:20) Whoever curses his father or his mother, His lamp will be put out in deep darkness.

B. (Lev 19:32) 'You shall rise before the gray headed and honor the presence of an old man, and fear your God: I am the LORD.

C. (Lev 19:3) 'Every one of you shall revere his mother and his father, and keep My Sabbaths: I am the LORD your God.

D. (Deu 27:16) 'Cursed is the one who treats his father or his mother with contempt.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen!'

### III. HONOR YOUR PARENTS WITH APPRECIATION & CARE

A. (1 Tim 5:4, 8) But if any widow has children or grandchildren, let them first learn to show piety at home and to repay their parents; for this is good and acceptable before God... But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

B. (Mark 7:9-13) He said to them, "All too well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your tradition. {10} "For

Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who curses father or mother, let him be put to death.' {11} "But you say, 'If a man says to his father or mother, "Whatever profit you might have received from me is Corban";' (that is, a gift to God), {12} "then you no longer let him do anything for his father or his mother, {13} "making the word of God of no effect through your tradition which you have handed down. And many such things you do."

## CONCLUSION

A. O.T. - (Exo 20:12) "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God is giving you.

B. N.T. - (Eph 6:2-3) "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: {3} "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."
